Message From the Chair

If you have not visited the board office lately, located in Oklahoma City at the Oklahoma Engineering Center, you are encouraged to drop by and see the newly renovated Dresser Library/Board Room. What started out as a "replace the carpet and paint the walls" effort, turned into a full-fledged construction project with jackhammers, a new audio/video system, and a beautiful new hexagonal conference table. Our very capable Executive Director, Ms. Kathy Hart, coordinated the project. She served as our ad hoc general contractor and coordinated all work including planning, purchasing, color selections, coordination of contractors, final inspection and final payment to all contractors. The Oklahoma Engineering Foundation financed the carpet, blinds, paint and plumbing for the project, and the Board financed the furniture, furnishings, electrical work for the audio-visual and communication equipment and board table, and architectural services from Jim Loftis, AIA. Bob Zahl, P.E., AIA, Board Member and partner in Zahl-Ford, Inc., contributed valuable assistance with architectural and audio-visual elements of the project and the MEP firm of which I am President, PSA Consulting Engineers, Inc., contributed the electrical engineering and design work required for the project.

All of the new electrical systems, including power, data, audio/video, and telephone are now distributed from below floor level. The existing concrete slab in the floor was cut, sawed and jackhammered out for the placement of new conduits and combination power/data floor boxes. The boxes are flush mounted with the floor surface and all new cables routed neatly from the floorboxes up under the new table and into popup power/data outlets at the top of the table for easy connection of systems to the laptops.

The new hexagonal configuration of the conference room table allows for more direct "face to face" conversation during meetings and disciplinary proceedings. More and more, the board is required to review engineering and surveying plans during disciplinary hearings to determine final disciplinary actions in those proceedings. To help facilitate this effort, a portable interactive lectern was installed so that exhibits can be shown on the new 63" diagonal video screen. All of the new audio/visual was part of a new system purchased from Ford Audio. The benefit of the lectern being portable is that we can also utilize it during larger meetings that are conducted at the Oklahoma Engineering Center in the larger auditorium, where we also installed a new projector in the ceiling. This equipment was used for the first time in the auditorium at the public meeting of the Board regarding residential foundations in July of this year. This audio-visual equipment is state of the art, and allows the board and enforcement staff to handle the ever-increasing volume of disciplinary matters and other matters before the Board.

The proposed draft has been revised since the public meeting held on September 7, 2007. The Board will continue to take public comment until the November 8, 2007 Board Meeting regarding these proposed revisions.

License Expirations April 1, 2007 to June 30, 2007

EXPIRATION/REVOCATION - Licenses may be revoked by the Board for non-payment of renewal fees. Licensees will be notified of revocation by certified mail. Typically this notification is mailed 10 days following expiration.

RENEWALS - Each license issued by the Board expires on the last day of the month in which renewal fees are due, and becomes invalid on that date unless paid. One notice of the renewal is sent by first class mail to the address of record in the board files. This in effect provides notice two months prior to revocation.

REINSTATEMENT - Former licensees whose certificates have expired and were revoked for failure to pay renewal fees and desire to reinstate shall make application for reinstatement within 180 days after expiration and pay the prescribed renewal fee and penalty. After 180 days, a new application will be required, which shall be considered specifically by the Board, both from the standpoint of competency and of character.

ALONG THE PATH TO COMPLIANCE

THE FRONT LINES OF PRACTICE

Board Rule OAC 245: 15-23-8: "When information comes to a licensee, the Board, or its employees concerning alleged misconduct by any person, firm, entity or licensee, whether through formal or informal channels, it shall be the duty of such person, firm, or entity to refer such information to the Director of Enforcement."

A significant number of the cases investigated by this Board come from information furnished by our licensees. Being on the front lines of practice, licensees are often in the best position to observe misconduct by others and have the perspective and understanding to know that a particular practice by an individual or firm is a violation of the laws and rules governing the practice. If you are asked to be a part of a team of other architects, engineers, and surveyors who may be from out of state or not properly licensed in Oklahoma, you may want to check first to make sure that they are licensed to practice in Oklahoma prior to signing onto the project. Many of our cases involve out of state engineers who begin projects in Oklahoma before they are licensed to do so. Sometimes the individual or firm is unaware that they are violating or may be on the verge of violation the law, and when educated in a helpful, professional manner, will promptly come into compliance. Otherwise, it is your duty to report violations to this Board

The same is true for land surveyors on the front lines of practice. If you find that a Certified Corner Record has not been filed or that there is a disagreement in a boundary, the first action should be a courtesy call to the other surveyor. Of course professionals have differences of opinion, and simple resolution of the matter might not occur. But communication between parties is an essential first step in the process.

What is your responsibility as a licensed professional if you bring an alleged violation to the violator's attention and the issue is not resolved? While we may not want to be whistleblowers, putting life, health, property and the public welfare has to come first. That's why Board Rule 245: 15-23-8 uses the term "*duty*" to refer in the information to the Director of Enforcement. Most likely if a violator does not respond to a respectful request from another professional, the violator does not have any intention of complying with our laws and may not be guided by the interest of serving the public. To protect the public and to protect our professions from being tarnished, you do have the responsibility to act.

The individual referring the information to the Board Director of Enforcement need not be identified. However, we do not encourage anonymous complaints because communication with a complainant, especially a knowledgeable professional, is very necessary to gather the proper information to successfully prosecute violations. Often they have evidence or technical information that this office may not be able to obtain from other sources.

Communicating with each other as professionals is something we owe each other. Seeing that our laws and rules governing the practice of engineering and land surveying are respected and followed is a duty we owe the public and our professions. As professionals on the front lines, our first priority must always be the protection of the health, safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of the state of Oklahoma.





Disciplinary Activity of the Board

July 12-13, 2007

In the Matter of Ford N. Bohl and Bohl and Associates, Inc.; Case No. 2006-105;

Through Consent: For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of authorization to do so on a swimming pool project, Bohl and Associates, Inc. is found Guilty, ordered to cease and desist until such time as it is authorized to practice engineering in this state and assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,750.00. For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of licensure to do so on a swimming pool project, Ford N. Bohl is found Guilty, ordered to cease and desist until such time as he is authorized to practice engineering in this state and assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,750.00.

In the Matter of Carl Wayne Willyard, PLS 227 and Carl Willyard Surveying, CA 2802; Case No. 2007-029; Summary of Findings of Fact and Order:

- For failing to file multiple certified corner records on a survey,
- For failing to achieve minimum standards on two surveys as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying as follows:
 1. Failing to include contact information and certificate of authorization number and date of expiration of the certificate of authorization,
 2. Failing to include basis of bearings, and
 3. Failing to show all changes in direction by angles, bearings or azimuths and failing to show all curve information as required.
- For failing to achieve minimum standards on an additional survey as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying as follows:
 1. Failing to acquire the record description, prior to making the survey, which was both available and necessary,
 2. Failing to analyze the data and make careful determination of the record title boundary of the property as required,
 3. Failing to include a basis of bearing,
 4. Failing to show all changes in direction by angles, bearings or azimuths and failing to show all curve information as required,
 5. Failing to establish or confirm a monument at each property corner on the boundary of the property being surveyed and not showing all found or set monuments on the survey, and
 6. Failing to provide enough information on the survey to substantiate that the survey did not exceed the allowable error of closure as required;

Carl Wayne Willyard is found Guilty of violating the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act and the Rules of this Board; violating the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying; Gross Negligence; Gross Incompetence; and Misconduct. Further, Carl Willyard Surveying is found Guilty of violating the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying; Gross Negligence; Gross Incompetence; and Misconduct. The Board orders that Mr. Willyard's license PLS 227 be placed on probation for a period of one year. During the probation, all survey work done by Mr. Willyard, with the exception of mortgage inspections and construction staking, shall be reviewed and approved by a licensed land surveyor. During the period of probation Mr. Willyard shall take and pass both the OLS Exam and NCEES PS Exam; otherwise probation may be extended.

In the Matter of MSE Technology Applications, Inc., CA 5219 and Brian T. Park, PE 22766; Case No. 2007-040; Through Consent: For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma on a project without a certificate of authorization to do so, MSE Technology Applications, Inc. is found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$2,000.00, and is Reprimanded. For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma on a project without a certificate of licensure to do so, Brian T. Park is found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,000.00 and is Reprimanded.

In the Matter of Plant Process Equipment, Inc., CA 5212 and Larry David Nicholson; Case No. 2007-044; Through Consent: For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma on a project without a certificate of authorization to do so, Plant Process Equipment, Inc. is found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$2,000.00 and is Reprimanded. For practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma on a project without a certificate of licensure to do so, Larry David Nicholson is found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$1000.00 and is ordered to Cease and Desist from practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma until such time as he is licensed to do so.

Alliance Surveying LLC is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of \$1,500.00 and is Reprimanded.
