**A. Hearing on Respondent's Motion in James Knight v. Holiday Inn Express & Suites & Zenith Insurance Co., File #CM2014-06101Q**

The hearings before the Commission en banc will be conducted pursuant to the authority and jurisdiction of the Administrative Workers' Compensation Act, Title 85A O.S. §1 et seq., and the Workers' Compensation Commission's Emergency Rules, OAC 810.

**1. Consideration and Discussion of Respondent's Motion to Set Aside and Request for Rehearing**

Respondent filed a Motion to Set Aside and Request for Rehearing. The motion seeks to set aside the Order Affirming Decision of Administrative Law Judge issued by the Commission en banc on May 26, 2015 and requests rehearing of oral arguments. Greg A. Barnard is the attorney of

record for the Claimant and Jennifer E. Jackson is the attorney of record for the Respondent.

**Possible Action:**

Possible action may include, but is not limited to: granting the motion and issuing an order to that effect, or denying the motion and issuing an order to that effect.

**2. Rehearing of Oral Arguments**

In the event that the Respondent's Motion to Set Aside and Request for Rehearing is granted, both parties will be allowed to present their oral arguments in Respondent's appeal from the Order issued by Administrative Law Judge Egan. The procedure for the hearings before the Commission en banc is as follows:

- Each party will be allowed ten (10) minutes for oral arguments.
- The appellant will present first. Appellant may divide his or her ten minutes for argument, allowing a portion of that time for rebuttal.
- Both parties are subject to questioning by Commissioners.

**Possible Action:**

Possible action may include, but is not limited to: taking no action, affirming the order and decision of the Administrative Law Judge and issuing an order to that effect, or taking preliminary action in the matter to reverse, modify, remand or if otherwise do not fully affirm the order of the Administrative Law Judge and instructing the Law Clerk or other staff member to draft a proposed Order to be considered in further deliberations at a future Commission meeting, or continuing the matter.
