The Department of Commerce and the Tourism and Recreation Department, 900 N. Stiles Ave., are housed in the former Maywood Presbyterian Church. Constructed in 1906 in an undeveloped residential neighborhood, the building is now situated in the Oklahoma State Capitol Complex, OU Medical Center and Research Park.

The historic building is a testament to Oklahoma's past and its vibrant future. The church was designed by architect William N. Meredith in a Romanesque ecclesiastical style and second in the main auditorium and balcony.

## State Tenants Vacate First National Center

The First National Center was built in 1931 and, at \$5 million, was the largest and costliest building constructed during the oil boom era in Oklahoma City.

Several state agencies have officed in the building, including the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, Oklahoma Land Commission, Oklahoma Tax Commission, Pardon and Parole Board, Aeronautics Commission and the Department of Securities.

Due to deteriorating conditions, OMES and the agencies recently staged an emergency relocation in order to avoid

potential interruption of service to the public and to ensure a safe work environment.

The exceptional attitudes and efforts of all involved were key factors in quickly relocating. OMES Information Services completed all the necessary cabling and workstation relocation. OMES Central Purchasing procured movers and worked closely with the agencies to coordinate moves.
