


# Oklahoma Wetlands Program

The Oklahoma Wetlands Program is administered through a partnership which includes state, local, and federal agencies, academic institutions, and non-governmental organizations that play a part in managing wetlands on behalf of the citizens of Oklahoma. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission manages the website on behalf of all partners. The program provides:

- Assessment and restoration of wetlands
- Stream corridor restoration
- Demonstration activities and programs
- Educational opportunities for youth and adults



The Oklahoma Wetlands Program has just published the Oklahoma Wetlands Program website, which is intended as a clearinghouse for all wetlands-related information in Oklahoma. The Wetlands Program website was designed for ease of navigation in order to lead all users to the desired information, even if they do not know exactly what information is available. Topics include information on restoration of wetlands, as well as resources for landowners, developers, researchers, and educators.
