School Security Training and Grant Program

The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security (OKOHS) is proud to announce its 2011 School Security Training and Grant Program. This program is designed to educate Oklahoma public schools on several school security issues, and to enable them to deal with those issues effectively. OKOHS will be hosting nine two-day school security training courses free of charge to any Oklahoma school. Schools that attend one of these courses are eligible to apply for one of sixteen \$21,500 school security grants which is to be used toward the purchase of school security equipment. Two grants are awarded per Homeland Security Region. Schools are not required to attend a course in their region. However, the grant award is contingent on the attendance of a school district member and a local law enforcement officer, who will receive 16 hours of CLEET training. In addition, applicants must submit a security assessment to OKOHS. These assessments will be peer-reviewed and provide a critical foundation for improving each school's security. School districts that have previously attended this course are eligible to participate, but are required to update their school threat assessment.


