What Prompted the Change in Reporting Systems?

The ICIS Reporting System had multiple restrictions, which inaccurately depicted prevention services delivered in Oklahoma:

- Originally developed for treatment services
- Inaccuracies in coding prevention activities
- Limitations in reporting total population served
- Duplication of reporting activities when multiple staff were involved
- Only the ODMHSAS Prevention Staff could run reports on data entered into the system

How the OKPROS Differs from ICIS

- Designed specifically to capture prevention services
- User friendly
- RPC can run reports on information entered into the system
- Decreased potential for errors in reporting services/activities
- Elimination of duplicate entries and unnecessary questions

Purpose of OKPROS

- Accurately capture prevention services being delivered
- Collect data to fulfill federal reporting requirements
- Determine if contract requirements are being met
- Develop reports to determine compliance rates, track media outputs and assess key strategic partnership and coalition relationship progression
