CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Jessica Hawkins called the June Governor's Task Force on the Prevention of Underage Drinking meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. and declared a quorum was not present.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Ms. Hawkins welcomed the members and the guests.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The May meeting minutes were distributed and reviewed by the members. No action was taken.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING 2M2L REPORT

Ms. Adrienne Rollins provided the group with the 2M2L report. The rural 2M2L Academy will be held at Western Hills Guest Ranch in Wagoner from July 19 – 22, 2010. The urban 2M2L Academy will be held at the National Center for Employee Development in Norman from July 27 – 30, 2010.

Each Academy will have a focus on teambuilding, community action planning and environmental prevention strategies. Following each Academy the youth will take back the information learned back to their local 2M2L clubs.

The next 2M2L Law Enforcement Training will be held in Lawton in October of 2010. Lawton police are making this training mandatory to all of their new cadets. Applications for 2M2L club stipends will be open within the next few months. Clubs who get selected will be awarded a stipend of \$300.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE OPPA REPORT

Ms. Stacy Potter announced that the OPPA Retreat was held on June 4, 2010. During the meeting, priorities were selected for upcoming year for the OPPA, which included the Social Host Law, designation of a single state authority responsible for the enforcement of laws on 3.2 beer, marketing of fetal alcohol signage in retail outlets and a program which will award retailers for consistently not selling alcohol and/or 3.2 beer to minors. Originally the OPPA voted to also focus on the outlaw of K2, but after the OPPA meeting it was discovered that the product will be outlawed in Oklahoma beginning in November. Each priority has a subcommittee, which consists of OPPA members.

Raye Shilen of the Wichita Mountains Prevention Network in Ardmore was selected as the new OPPA chair.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING 2010 UNDERAGE DRINKING LEGISLATION

Ms. Potter provided an update on the status of legislature bills. Senator Leftwich's party bus bill (SB1762) passed and was approved by the Governor; Representative Duncan's bill (HB2297) did not make it through the legislative process, Representative Schwartz's home brewing bill (HB2348) passed and was approved by the Governor, Senator Ford's caterers' licensing bill (SB1964) passed and was approved by the Governor.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Gayle Jones stated that Title four has been closed out. Schools have recently received their last allocation. Approximately 190 school districts received additional Title four money, which can be carried over through the next school year.

Ms. Jones also announced that the Bridge grant that the Department of Education applied for will be awarded in late August with a September 1, 2010 start date. It is a 12 month grant which is funded in the amount of \$125,000.

Ms. Hawkins announced the State Epidemiological Workgroup has narrowed down their priorities to include underage drinking prevention or prescription drugs with a focus on opiates. The Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant (SPF-SIG) Advisory Council will meet on June 22, 2010 to select a priority. The SPF-SIG grant is a \$12 million grant for our state.

The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's (OJJDP) 12th Annual National Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws (EUDL) Leadership Conference will be held August 18 – 20, 2010 in Anaheim, California. Stacy Potter and Adrienne Rollins will be presenting at this conference on the Oklahoma Reality Party Media Campaign.

ODMHSAS is submitting an application for the National Exemplary Award for the Reality Party Media Campaign. The awards will be given out at the National Prevention Network (NPN) conference in September.

Ms. Potter announced that there will be a Community Oriented Policing (COP) training held on June 28, 2010 in Vinita with a rural focus and on June 29, 2010 in Tulsa with an urban focus. Both trainings are free of charge.

Ms. Ann Barnes announced that the American Indian Institute has applied for an OJJDP grant.
