CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Jessica Hawkins called the February 15, 2011 Underage Drinking Prevention Committee meeting to order. A quorum was not present.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Ms. Hawkins welcomed the members and the guests.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The January meeting minutes were distributed and reviewed by the members.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE OKLAHOMA PREVENTION POLICY ALLIANCE (OPPA) REPORT

Ms. Ashley Cline updated the members on HB 1211 which is in the Judiciary Committee and SB 859 which was referred to the Public Safety Committee. Ms. Cline informed the members that OPPA members will be at the Capitol on Thursday passing out fliers on Social Host around noon. Discussion continued around the wine/strong beer bills, HB 1010. McAfrrey is the author and has been referred to the Rules Committee. HB 1034, which is authored by Peters was also discussed and has been referred to the Rules Committee as well. Ms. Stacy Potter stated Representative Glen is opposed and everyone else is opposed due to the accessibility of the wine and strong beer to youth in the grocery and convenience stores. Ms. Cline informed the members that Ms. Raye Shilen is working on compiling a comprehensive list of legislative issues OPPA will monitor.

The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) is in the process of developing a policy brief which is around four pages. The University of Oklahoma (OU) is looking at the economic impact on the state; which includes possibly developing and bringing more money in the state, public health impact, the cost to the state and consequences to the state. There was a suggestion for OPPA to use the economic piece; wine being manufactured outside the state which will stimulate outside State's economic income flow and Oklahoma will not profit. No action was taken.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ENFORCING THE UNDERAGE DRINKING LAWS (EUDL) UPDATE AND 2MUCH2LOSE (2M2L) YOUTH COUNCIL REPORT

Ms. Adrienne Rollins provided an update on the EUDL grant. Ms. Rollins stated she received 22 applicants for the 2M2L Club stipends and will be able to fund all. There will be a Youth Leadership Institute Training of Trainers (TOT) next month; started with 25 available spots which 22 spots have been filled. Ms. Rollins elaborated on the Woodward 2M2L Law Enforcement Training, which occurred in February. During the training they conducted compliance checks, which two out of four retailers sold to the youth.

The Tulsa County Law Enforcement Task Force has developed a calendar of events, which includes compliance checks every month; shoulder taps will be performed around prom and graduation. Media has been arranged for each event. Oklahoma County Law Enforcement Task Force had contract issues and Ms. Rollins will meet with them next Wednesday for their calendar of events.

The Regional Coordinator bids are out and finished. There will be a 2M2L training in Lawton on Monday and Tuesday with their police department. There will be a 2M2L Academy Kick-off the last week of July and there's no scheduled date for the rural Kick-off. At the moment, the 2M2L Youth Advisory Council is trying to get donations for a Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) conference following the urban Academy. No action was taken

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE STRATEGIC PREVENTION FRAMEWORK STATE INCENTIVE GRANT (SPF-SIG)

Ms. Hawkins provided a brief update on the SPF-SIG. The Oklahoma City Intertribal Board received the SPF-SIG as well. There has been a collaborative meeting between Oklahoma City Intertribal Board and the ODMHSAS. Mr. Young Onuorah, SPF-SIG Project Manager with the ODMHSAS, will learn what the Oklahoma City Intertribal Board is doing and there will be an update provided at the next meeting. The SPF-SIG team is working on the bid package which was extended to July instead of April. Ms. Hawkins informed the members of the Oklahoma Prevention Leadership Collaborative (OPLC) meeting which will be held at 2:30 p.m. at Red Cross of Oklahoma City. During the OPLC meeting tomorrow, there will be a thorough SPF update, a demonstration of the data query system and an evidence-based strategy update. No action was taken.

DICUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE REVIEW OF RELEVANT BILLS

There were discussion around bills that were of interest to the Underage Drinking Prevention Committee, the ODMHSAS and OPPA. Ms. Hawkins stated the ODMHSAS will be following: HB 1354 – McAffrey; HJR 1015 – Schwartz; and SB 324 – Brown. There were discussions around SB 65 authored by Ellis concerning the five hour energy drinks; SB 509 authored by Shortey which prohibits alcohol and tobacco signage on buses and will add language around prescription drugs. HB 1635 and SB 271 are identical bills and the ABLE Commission will be meeting with the author. The Committee continued to discuss SB 659 authored by Jolley concerning sampling limit to one ounce at a festival and one glass on premises. Other bills that were discussed included SB 859, HB 1963 and SB 861. No action was taken.

**DICUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE
“FREE THE BOWL” OKLAHOMA AWARD WINNER**

The Committee viewed the video of the third place winner of the Marin Institute’s Free the Bowl award; he is from Westfield, Oklahoma. He may perform at the Prevention Reception on March 23, 2011. No action was taken.
