ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

Problem gambling is a common co-occurring disorder among addiction treatment populations. Over 50% of problem gamblers seeking care may have an addiction problem and up to 30% of addicts in treatment for substance abuse issues have a serious gambling problem.

Accurate assessments and coordinated treatment is important for effective care of clients with a gambling disorder in addition to a mental health or substance abuse disorder.

- List the three most common co-occurring disorders among problem gamblers.
- Discuss the prioritizing of care among problem gamblers with co-occurring disorders.
- List and describe three key elements of treatment among those with serious mental illness and problem gambling concerns.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Joanna Franklin received her Bachelors degree and Masters degree from Johns Hopkins University. She was the first counselor hired by the first state-funded gambling treatment program at Johns Hopkins in 1979. She has worked as the Director of Adult Services for the Psychiatric Institute of Washington and is the Director of Training and Network Development for Trimeridian Inc.- Resources for Problem Gambling.

She has designed and delivered clinical training programs in 45 states, 10 Canadian provinces, among 31 tribes and in 9 other countries. She has consulted and trained for the FBI, CIA, the Pentagon, the Navy and the Army. She designed and implemented responsible gaming trainings for state lotteries, race tracks and casinos internationally. She has authored two book chapters for Harvard publications on Family Therapy and Teen Gambling, and published journal articles on problem gambling treatment.

Ms. Franklin is President of the International Gambling Counselor Certification Board, President of the Maryland Council on Problem Gambling, Officer and Board member of the Association of Problem Gambling Service Administrators, Director of Training for the University of Maryland Medical School Center for Problem Gambling and the Director of Helpline and Director of Training and Prevention Services for the Council on Compulsive Gambling of Pennsylvania.

She is winner of the Herman Goldman Award for Lifetime Service to Problem Gamblers and Their Families, the Council on Compulsive Gambling of New Jersey's "Person of the Year Award," and the first winner of the National Council on Problem Gambling Award for Distinguished Volunteer Services.
