Makes it a misdemeanor punishable with a fine for an illegal alien to be in possession of a firearm. Authorizes off-duty officers to carry service weapons. State preemption for carrying to include both SDA and the Firearms Act of 1971.

11	<a href="#">HB3693</a>	<a href="#">CALVEY</a>	21 §1290.2 – Definitions 21 §1290.5 – Term of License and Renewal 21 §1290.9 – Eligibility 21 §1290.12 – Procedure for Application 21 §1290.14 – Safety and Training Course 21 §1290.18 – Application Form Contents 21 §1290.18 – License Form	Defines “resident” and “nonresident,” drops resident’s fee to \$25, allows nonresidents to apply for \$50 with comparable training to SDA, requires NICS check only to determine eligibility, removes sheriffs from process, mandates that instructors’ and non-residents’ license cards indicate their status. Limits application contents to include only specified information and adds any information required by ATF.
12	<a href="#">SB0006</a>	<a href="#">BRECHEEN</a>	21 §1289.31 – NEW LAW	Allows specified state and federally elected officials to carry in Oklahoma while in performance of their duties after taking SDA mandated training. <b>Carryover Bill.</b>
13	<a href="#">SB0043</a>	<a href="#">LEEWRIGHT</a>	21§1277 Unlawful Carry In Certain Places,	Removes notification to OSBI by colleges, universities or technology centers for violators of this act, also suspension of SDA license and administrative fines. <b>Carryover Bill.</b>
14	<a href="#">SB0275</a>	<a href="#">DAHM</a>	21 §1272 – Unlawful Carry 21 §1289.24 – Firearm Regulation – State Preemption	Removes “billy” from the list of items it is unlawful to carry. Precludes municipalities from adopting ordinances regarding discharge of firearms when in legitimate defense of self or others. Narrows policy regulations of knives at schools to apply to students only. Limits municipalities from creating ordinances related to firearm or ammunitions components or related supplies. Allows a person adversely affected by any order, ordinance or regulation violating the preemption provisions to bring civil action with terms defined. <b>Carryover Bill.</b>
15	<a href="#">SB0910</a>	<a href="#">DAHM</a>	21 §1290.8 - Possession of License Notification To Police of Gun	Minor language change. Removes the word “bow,” in describing hunting as it relates to authorizing carry while engaged in hunting or fishing and adds the word, “scouting.”
16	<a href="#">SB0957</a>	<a href="#">BERGSTROM</a>	21 §1289.25 – Physical or Deadly Force Against Intruder	Authorizes defensive force in places of worship.
17	<a href="#">SB1024</a>	<a href="#">BICE</a>	21 §1290.9 – Eligibility 21 §1290.18 – Application Form Contents 21 §1290.25 – Legislative Intent	Makes lawful permanent residents eligible for SDA.
18	<a href="#">SB1158</a>	<a href="#">SCOTT</a>	21 §1283 - Convicted Felons and Delinquents	Removes language making it unlawful for a felon or a delinquent to be a passenger in a vehicle with a firearm
19	<a href="#">SB1212</a>	<a href="#">DAHM</a>	21 §1277 – Unlawful Carry in Certain Places	Adds wildlife refuge and wildlife management area to prohibited places.
